Happy second anniversary to Square Dance Minnesota (SDM). It will be two years tomorrow that SDM was created to become

a non-profit organization to promote and teach square dancing in all its heritage forms.

Not only did SDM celebrate its first anniversary last year on July 19, it was also able to celebrate the July 15, 2016 Internal Revenue Service (IRS) group exemption letter recognizing its affiliate organizations with 501(c)(3) status as public charities.

Since receipt of the group exemption letter, SDM completed and the IRS accepted Form 990-N for fiscal/calendar years 2014 and 2015 for those organizations that were included in the annual renewal last year. (For the organizations that joined SDM since September 2015, your Form 990-N will be completed as soon as the IRS updates its data base after our annual renewal this year.)

Five organizations joined SDM this year – existing organizations Kato Plus, North Country Plus, and St Peter Squares (Riverbend Promenaders); and newly established organizations Valley Stars and Kaleidoscope Squares.

Website <u>www.squaredancemn.com</u> includes information about SDM, an event calendar, educational opportunities, news, fliers, links, operating procedures, fillable forms, and dance location information. The website averages approximately 1,600 visitors a month.
